University Partner Program

Program Description

The WorldCHAT Program will provide a platform for international participants to listen, speak and interact directly with Sonoma State University (SSU) students and faculty. Using a live, online platform, participants will hear from SSU faculty and students about a variety of higher education topics and be able to ask questions and engage with the SSU student throughout the session.

Duration and Content

This program lasts 10 weeks, but the length can be customizable based on content and class size. The session will last one hour and will include an interactive presentation with small group discussions followed by a Question and Answer period. The final session may include presentations by the participants and the awarding of a badge or certification to those that attend all sessions.

Audience

The participants that will benefit from the program will be international students or people that want to study about or in the U.S. There are multiple benefits from participating in this program, such as increased listening and speaking skills, expanded knowledge of U.S. history and current issues, elevated vocabulary, among others.

Location of Sessions

Sessions can occur as part of an existing course in the Partner university that focuses on English language learning and U.S. culture and/or history. Additionally, sessions can be made into a standalone course for students who are interested in expanding their language skills and learning more about U.S. culture and issues.

Session Topics

Welcome and Introductions

 - All topics are reviewed

 - Group Chat example questions: Which topic would you like to learn more about and how can you learn more?
